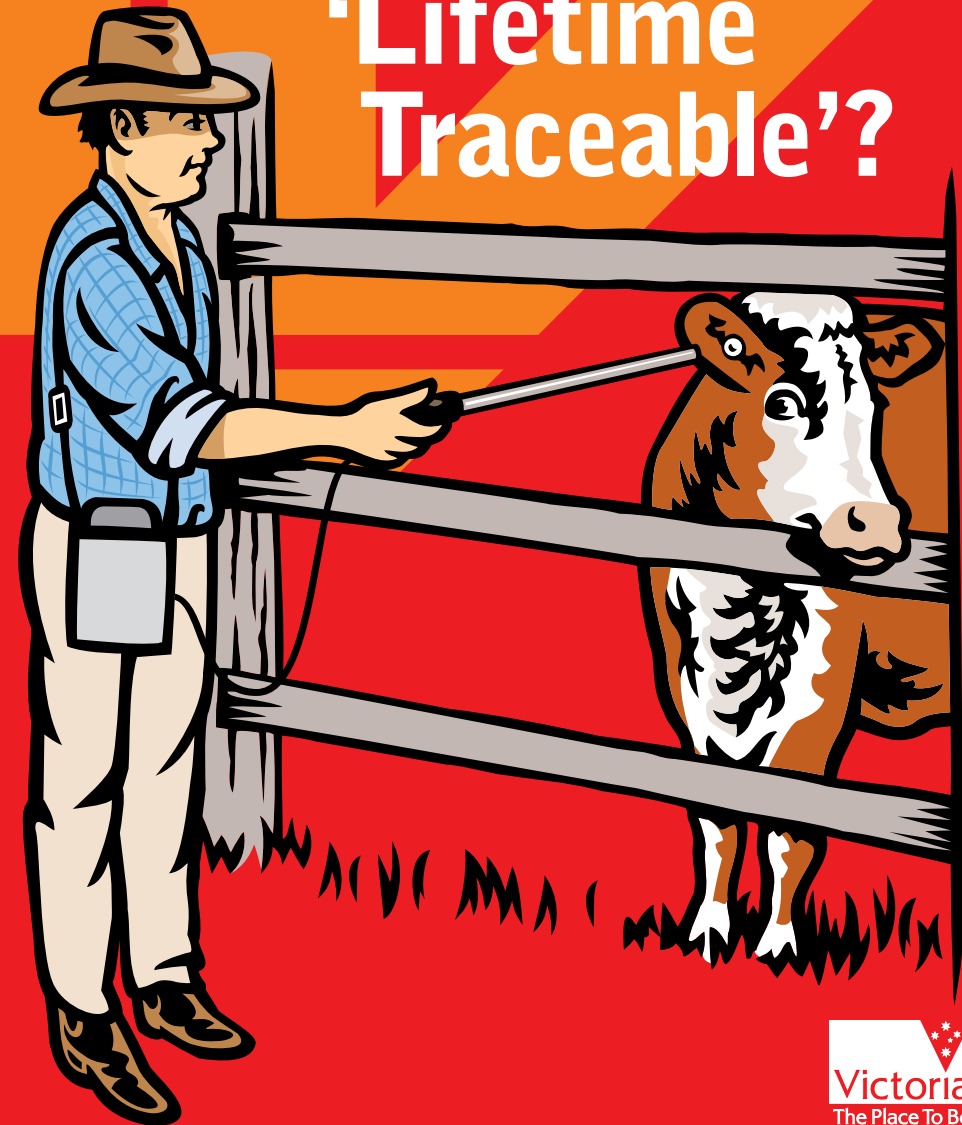

Is it 'Lifetime Traceable'?



'Lifetime Traceable'

'Lifetime Traceable' is a status assigned to NLIS identified cattle where every property of residence in an animal's life has been registered on the NLIS database. A vendor can only tick the 'Lifetime Traceable' box where no gap exists in the movement history of each beast in the consignment as recorded on the NLIS database. In addition, the database must display a positive 'Lifetime Traceable' status against the NLIS Device carried by each of the cattle.

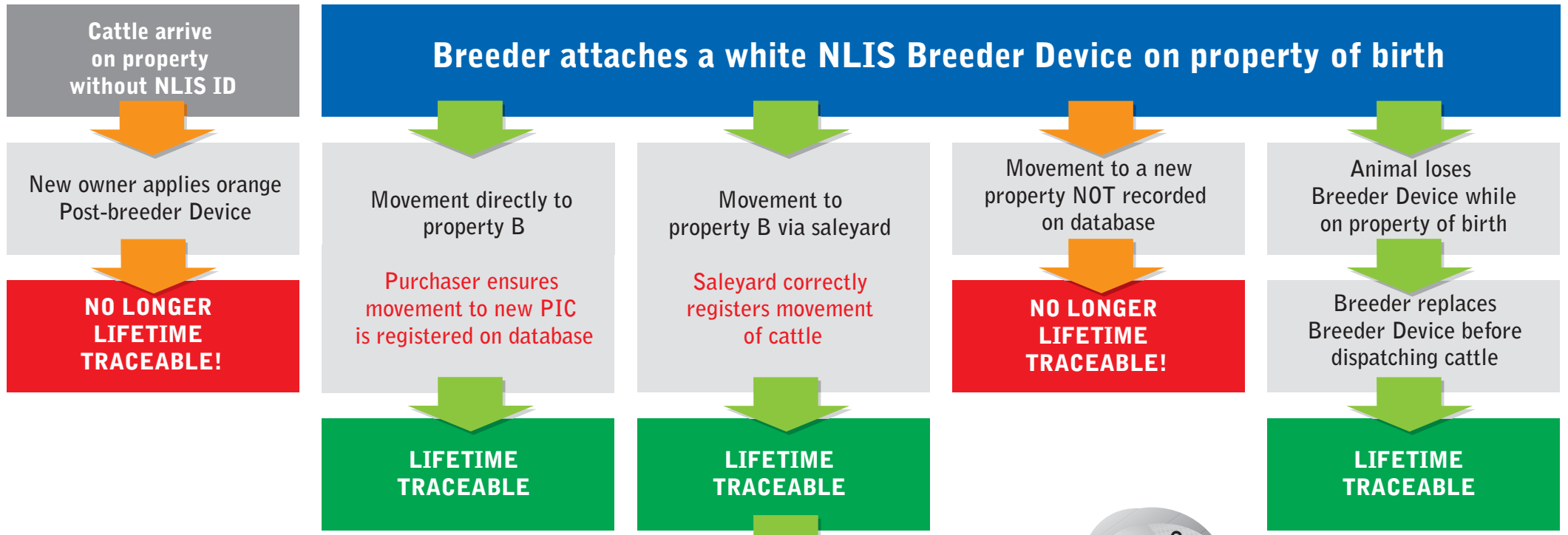

IS IT 'LIFETIME TRACEABLE'?

This chart shows examples of different scenarios and how they affect Lifetime Traceability.

REMEMBER

Lifetime Traceability can only be claimed if all transactions - from birth to slaughter - have been recorded on the NLIS database.
