

IMPORTANT NOTICE

MOVEMENT TO SOUTH AUSTRALIA OF POTATOES GROWN WITHIN THE COLAC-OTWAY OR PORTLAND PLANT PROTECTION DISTRICTS

Primary Industries and Resources South Australia (PIRSA) advises that:

- ware potatoes (including one-off seed) and
- unwashed potatoes for processing in South Australia

grown within the Colac-Otway or Portland Plant Protection Districts (PPDs), now require a Plant Health Certificate issued by a DPI Plant Standards Officer in order to enter South Australia.

PIRSA also specifies that transporters carrying vegetables, fruit, plant materials and related equipment into South Australia must now provide a manifest to PIRSA indicating their impending arrival in South Australia.

To arrange for certification for a consignment of the potatoes described above from the Colac-Otway or Portland PPDs to South Australia:

1. Complete the Description of Consignment shown overleaf (or a copy).
2. Fax to **Belinda Mascadri** at DPI Ellinbank – fax (03) 5624 2200 (phone 0448 916 506):
 - the completed Description of Consignment **and**
 - a Statutory Declaration, together with potato cyst nematode (PCN) survey results, stating that the potatoes indicated on the Description of Consignment were grown on a property which tested negative for PCN.
3. A DPI Plant Standards Officer will generate a Plant Health Certificate from this information and promptly return it to you by fax - **please note that 24 hours' notice of this request is required and the service will not be available on weekends or public holidays.**
4. Ensure that the faxed copy of the Plant Health Certificate received from DPI accompanies the consignment to South Australia.

Please note that the cost of issuing the certificate is \$38.50. The postal address of the exporter will be required by DPI so that the original Plant Health Certificate and an invoice can be forwarded.
