FRUIT FLY SITUATION IN THE STATE OF VICTORIA

Set out below is a summary of the Fruit Fly situation in Victoria as at 4th November 2009, within the last 12 months, Queensland Fruit Fly Outbreaks occurred in the towns listed below.

The dates of last detections and re-instatement dates are included.

1. SUSPENSION AREAS

The suspension area for WA, SA, VIC and the MIA (NSW) is 15km, for Tasmania 80km, for USA and NZ 15km, and for other international markets varies from 15/30/50/80 km depending on the country.

Please note that following meeting requirements, reinstatement for trade purposes for all international markets is subject to acceptance by relevant trading partners through AQIS. Where the requirements have been met, the location is "reinstated", meaning the location is "area free".

3. DETECTIONS

Plant Standards Centre 3 confirmed detections on interstate produce for the 4 months from 01-07-2009.

4. OUTBREAKS RE-INSTATED

- Barooga (NSW) 2008 was reinstated for one year on 06-10-2009.
- Moama (NSW) 2008 was reinstated for one year on 13-10-2009.
- Kensington 2008 was reinstated for one year on 27-10-2009.

5. CHEMICAL CONTROL PROGRAM

Wahgunyah, Rutherglen, Chiltern, Wangaratta 2008, and Barnawartha 2007 outbreaks are now subject to chemical control programs. Reinstatement will be sought at some time in the future.

6. PERIOD OF SUSPENSION

According to section 3.2.9 of the QFF C.O.P., "The period of suspension of fruit fly free pest status should remain in force until one generation and four weeks, or 12 weeks after the last wild fly is captured in the traps, or the last larvae is found, which ever is longer."

This document is to be used as the basis for the signing of intrastate and interstate movement of host product within the fruit fly pest free areas of all states.

N.B. towns used for re-instatement dates came from Appendix 5 in the 'Code of Practice for Management of Queensland Fruit Fly'.

Towns used from Appendix 5: (1) Albury, (2) Bendigo, (3) Benalla, (4) Tatura, (5) Swan Hill and, (6) Echuca For example: from Table 1, Rutherglen (1) means that Albury was used for the re-instatement dates for the outbreak at Rutherglen.
