

Professor RICHARD KLOSTERMAN

Richard Klosterman is a Professor of Planning, Geography and Urban Studies at the University of Akron. He is the author of *Community Analysis and Planning Techniques* (1990), co-editor of *Spreadsheet Models for Urban and Regional Analysis* (1994) and *Planning Support Systems* (Environmental Systems Research Institute, 2001). He is the developer of the What if?™ planning support system, a GIS-based tool that can be used to project land uses, residential population and employment for census enumeration areas and user-defined areas such as political jurisdictions, schools districts, and traffic analysis zones.



Dr. Klosterman holds a Ph.D. in City and Regional Planning from Cornell University and a B.S. in Civil Engineering from Purdue University. He has published widely in the areas of computer applications in planning, planning theory, and planning methods. He has held Visiting Professor positions at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, Rutgers University, Hong Kong University, and the International Islamic University of Malaysia.
